

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF ALTOGA WATER SUPPLY CORPORATION

STATE OF TEXAS

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

COUNTY OF COLLIN

WE, the undersigned natural persons of the age of twenty-one (21) years or more, at least three of whom are citizens of the State of Texas, acting as incorporators of a Corporation, do hereby adopt the following Articles of Incorporation for such Corporation:

ARTICLE 1:

The name of the Corporation is $\Lambda 1 \log n$ Water Supply Corporation.

ARTICLE II:

The Corporation is a non-profit Corporation organized under Article 1434a of the Revised Civil Statutes of Texas of 1925, as amended, supplemented by the Texas Non-Profit Corporation Act, Article 1.01 et seq., as amended, and is authorized to exercise all powers, privileges and rights conferred on a Corporation by these Acts, and all powers and rights incidental in carrying out the purposes for which the Corporation is formed, except such as are inconsistent with the express provisions of these Acts.

ARTICLE III.

The period of its duration is perpetual.

ARTICLE IV.

The Corporation is formed for the purpose of furnishing a water supply for general farm use and domestic purposes to individuals residing in the rural community of Altoga, Texas, and the surrounding rural areas. The places where the business of the Corporation is to be transacted shall be the Altoga Community in Collin County, Texas, and the surrounding rural areas.

ARTICLE V.

The street address of the initial registered office of the Corporation is Route 3, McKinney, Texas, and the name of its initial registered agent at such address is Billy Moore.

ARTICLE VI:

The number of directors constituting the initial Board of Directors of the Corporation is five (5), and the names and addresses of the persons who are to serve as the initial directors are:

Each incorporator shall be a member of the Board of Directors who are to serve as Directors until the first annual meeting of the members, or until their successors are elected and qualified.

ARTICLE VIII.

The Corporation is and shall continue to be a Corporation without capital stock, and membership in the Corporation shall be deemed personal estate and shall be transferable only on the books of the Corporation in such manner as the By-Laws may prescribe.

TO BE ADDED INTO THE ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

No director shall be liable to the Corporation or to the Corporation's membership for monetary damages for any act or omission in the director's capacity as a director of the Corporation, except and unless the director shall be found liable for a breach of the director's duty of loyalty to the Corporation or the Corporation's membership; and act or omission not in good faith that constitutes a breach of the director's duty to the Corporation or an act or omission that involves intentional misconduct or a knowing violation of the law on the part of the director; a transaction from which the director receives an improper benefit, whether or not the benefit results from an action taken within the scope of the director's office; or an act or omission for which the liability of the director is expressly provided by Texas law.
